# History of the Suffolk Peanut Festival

As the Suffolk Peanut Festival celebrates its 45th year, the history of the city's celebration of the peanut dates back to the days of World War II.

## The first festival

Suffolk held its first festival celebrating the peanut in January 1941.

The event included a parade, dances and balls and coronation of a queen, according to event history on the Peanut Fest website.

On the morning of the first fete, the Suffolk News-Herald summed up the excitement in town: "Within a few hours, the curtain will rise on Suffolk's annual National Peanut Festival. ... The whole city has been a beehive of i activity. Cooperation has been had from every civic group, every private citizen and from the world at large. ... The publicity which has been received already from all over the nation, the fact that Suffolk has united in a single thought for a single purpose and the knowledge that out of the work of a whole community a celebration is rising to do credit to Suffolk and the peanut industry at large."

While 10,000 people turned out for the first festival, that number swelled to around 50,000 by the time the event was held again in October 1941.


## **Today's festival**

The modern predecessor of today's Suffolk Peanut Fest was celebrated in September 1978 in downtown Suffolk. It was called "Harvest Fest" and was produced by the local chamber of commerce.

The event featured a parade, a hot-air balloon event, Carnival, dances, concerts and a festival queen. The festival was a downtown tradition until the event moved to the municipal airport in 1981.

For four days each October, Suffolk Peanut Fest now draws more than 125,000 people and has won the accolades of professional festival organizations and national magazines.



# Demolition derby returns with crashing good fun Saturday

The demolition derby returns to Suffolk Peanut Fest at 11:30 a.m. Saturday, Oct. 7, in the festival arena with bangs, crashes and booms the entire family will enjoy.

James Russell, Auto Thrill Show historian, said the idea for demolition derbies was conceived in the mind of a 28-year-old stock car driver named Larry Mendelsohn. He staged the first demo derby at Islip (Long Island, New York) Speedway in 1958. He had noticed how spectators were attracted by the crashes and smashes of stock car racing.

As it was then, Russell said, it is now with many of the fans stuck to the edge of their seats not as

anxious to witness skilled racing but to see the trauma and violence of the wrecks. This is how the now popular demolition derby was born.

The Demolition Derby begins with fun for children as the Kids Power Wheel Race begins at 11 a.m. Helmets are required and no open side power wheels.

# Roar around Great Dismal Swamp at 21st annual event

Bikers from Suffolk and the region are tuning up their engines for the 21st annual Suffolk Swamp Roar Motorcycle Rally.

This year's event, an 80-mile ride around the perimeter of the great Dismal Swamp National Wildlife Refuge, is set for Sunday, Oct. 8.

Registration begins that morning at 8 a.m. at the Suffolk Executive Airport on Highway 13, just south of downtown Suffolk. After the blessing of the bikes, the send-off begins at 11 a.m., rain or shine.

Registration is \$20 per person and \$10 per passenger. The fee includes a commemorative event pin and admission to Suffolk Peanut Fest. The first 100 registrants also receive a barbecue box lunch and a ride T-shirt.





The 9/11 NEVER FORGET Mobile Exhibit has connected people nationwide to our nation's history since 2013. From the Black Hills of South Dakota to the Tennessee State Fairgrounds and the golden hills of California to quaint New England villages, the memorial has been welcomed to nearly all 50 states and Canada.

"We have honored the sacrifices made that day with over 350,000 visitors to date," the Tunnel to Towers Foundation said in its news release. "This unique and moving education tool provided a window to the past so that future generations will learn from that tragic day. The Stephen Siller Tunnel to

Towers Foundation is committed to ensuring we will never forget."

The T2T Foundation launched this exhibit in 2013 as a tribute to those lost on 9/11, including the 343 members of the FDNY who made the ultimate sacrifice of saving and protecting others in the line of duty.

The high-tech, 80-foot tractortrailer transforms into a 1,100 sq. ft. exhibit and helps to further educate citizens around the country about the events of that tragic day, according to the foundation.

The exhibit includes interactive education, tower steel beams, other ground zero artifacts, documentary videos, first responder radio transmission recordings, and interactive guided tours from FDNY heroes.

The Tunnel to Towers Foundation's mission is to honor the sacrifice of firefighter Stephen Siller, who gave his life to save others on Sept. 11, 2001.

"We also honor our military and first responders who continue to make the supreme sacrifice of life and limb for our country," according to the festival website.


